Introduction

To minister to others in Jesus' name often means going where most others would not. Those who do so may wonder at times whether their efforts are significant. **Today's lesson reveals the answer.**

LESSON CONTEXT The setting of our lesson is during a busy day of teaching during the final week of Jesus' earthly ministry, as part of his "Olivet Discourse" of Matthew 24:3-25:46.

LESSON CONTEXT

The Olivet Discourse was set in motion when the disciples asked Jesus about the sign of his coming and of the end of the world Matthew 24:3

Matthew 25:31 NIV

³¹ "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. Matthew 25:32 NIV ³² All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

Matthew 25:33 NIV

³³ He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left

Matthew 25:34 NIV ³⁴ "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.
